

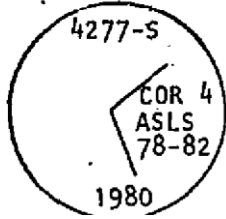
NOTES

1. THE CLAIMANTS CORNERS WERE RECOVERED IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO AND WERE USED TO CONTROL THE LOCATION OF THE TRACT CORNERS.
2. ALL COORDINATES SHOWN ARE BASED ON THE "ALASKA COORDINATE SYSTEM", ZONE 4.
3. THIS SURVEY WAS ACCOMPLISHED IN ACCORDANCE WITH OTE SI 78-73, AND AS 38.05.077.
4. THE TRACT IS SUBJECT TO A 10 FOOT PEDESTRIAN EASEMENT ALONG THE ORDINARY HIGH WATER LINE OF THE UNNAMED STREAM.
5. THE NATURAL MEANDERS OF THE LINE OF ORDINARY HIGH WATER FORMS THE TRUE BOUNDS OF THE TRACTS. THE APPROXIMATE LINE OF ORDINARY HIGH WATER AS SHOWN, IS FOR SURVEY COMPUTATIONS AND DATA ONLY, WITH THE TRUE TRACTS CORNERS BEING ON THE EXTENSION OF THE TRACT SIDE LINES AND THEIR INTERSECTIONS WITH THE NATURAL MEANDERS.
6. ALL BEARINGS AND DISTANCES SHOWN ARE TRUE MEAN BEARINGS AND TRUE DISTANCES.
7. THE DRAINAGE PATTERN WITHIN THE AREA BOUNDED BY THE SURVEY IS DRAINED BY NORMAL WATER RUNOFF.
8. THE MINIMUM BEARING AND DISTANCE CLOSURE OF THE EXTERIOR BOUNDARY OF THE SITE IS WITHIN THE ACCURACY OF ONE PART IN FIVE THOUSAND AS FIELD MONUMENTED.
9. EACH SITE IS COORDINATED TO THE RECTANGULAR SURVEY NET WITHIN A MINIMUM ACCURACY OF ONE PART IN TWO THOUSAND.
10. THE UTM AND METRIC DATA IS BEING SHOWN HEREON FOR INFORMATION PURPOSES ONLY.
